GUEST SPEAKER

First District Magistrate Dennis Mitchell wanted to address the City about flooding issues between Salt River and Blue Lick and talking about research that he and Robert Watkins had done. There could be a 5' storm drain in 5,220 in length approximately 20' underground that would service roughly 800 homes on Preston St., Blue Lick, Hwy. 44, in Mallard and The Pointe subdivisions. The project would take 688 truck loads of dirt and would be below utility and fiber optic lines. It could be possible that the project would qualify for grant money. Mr. Scott Fleming, Sewer Collections Supervisor, stated from the audience, that this area is the number one area in the KIPDA region
