CALL TO ORDER

With an invocation by Pastor Mike Miller, Family Day Ministries, and the recital of the Pledge of Allegiance, Mayor Curtis L. Hockenbury called the meeting to order at 6:30PM.

ROLL CALL

Present were Mmes. Lisa Carter, Stacey Cline, Bonnie Enlow and Deb Huffman as well as Mr. Kenny Newton and Mr. Larry Hatfield.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. Second reading ORDINANCE NO. 019-291

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 011-084 AND SETTING FEES FOR THE USAGE OF THE CITY OF SHEPHERDSVILLE'S WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITIES.

City Attorney Tammy Baker read the ordinance in full. Mayor Hockenbury wanted to know what councilmembers desired to do. Lisa Carter stated that the rate on this ordinance should remain at \$21.20 for the minimum charge. Larry Hatfield agreed, making the motion do not increase sewer rates at all inside and outside the City, including Jim Beam, and that this ordinance be repealed to read that we will discuss rates every May and every June. City Attorney Baker clarified the motion that it is to amend the ordinance rather than repeal it, which was met with a nod of the head. Seconded by Kenny Newton. Ayes carried. Ordinance will be amended to reflect the changes and come back for first reading in August.

B. Second reading ORDINANCE NO. 019-290

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 019-277 OF THE CITY OF SHEPHERDSVILLE, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY CONCERNING THE CREATION OF COLLECTIVE BARGAINING PROGRAM WITH THE SHEPHERDSVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT FIREFIGHTERS AND THE CITY OF SHEPHERDSVILLE, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY.

After City Attorney Tammy Baker read the ordinance in full, Lisa Carter made the motion to postpone indefinitely, seconded by Deb Huffman.

C. Second reading ORDINANCE NO. 019-295

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SHEPHERDSVILLE, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY PROHIBITING THE CASTING OUT OF DEBRIS INCLUDING GRASS AND LEAVES ONTO THE PUBLIC ROADWAY.

City Attorney Tammy Baker read the ordinance in full. Brief discussion ensued.

Motion made to accept the ordinance made by Deb Huffman, seconded by Lisa Carter.

Nayes carried, ordinance did not pass. Nayes - Kenny Newton, Larry Hatfield, Stacey Cline, Bonnie Enlow. Ayes – Deb Huffman, Lisa Carter.

New Business

A. Opening of bids received for FY 20 paving projects

City Clerk Wirthlin opened sealed bids and read as follows:

C. First reading ORDINANCE NO. 019-296

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 019-283 AND ADOPTING A PERSONNEL AND PAY RATE CLASSIFICATION PLAN FOR CITY EMPLOYEES AND NONELECTED CITY OFFICERS FOR THE CITY OF SHEPHERDSVILLE, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY.

City Attorney Tammy Baker read the ordinance in full and said that the ordinance was to clarify two and include an originally omitted position in the Fire Department.

D. Planning & Zoning representative appointee

Arthur Jones introduced Jeremy Kubac, a professional civil engineer with many years experience in transportation engineering who is currently employed by the firm of Gresham Smith. Mr. Kubac addressed council noting his move here in 2012 and desire to make a positive impact in the community.

Mayor asked for those in favor of the appointee which was Deb Huffman and Kenny Newton. Those against were Bonnie Enlow, Stacey Cline, Larry Hatfield, and Lisa Carter. 2 ayes, 4 nays.

E. Parade Permit Application Consideration

Youth football league small parade for Saturday July 27th from 8:30AM to 9AM.

Motion made by Larry Hatfield to accept, seconded by Stacey Cline. Ayes carried. 6-0.

William Dennison, Jr. – 1342 Hwy. 44 W – distributed a subpoena to all but the City Clerk regarding ownership and maintenance of property at 1412 Hwy.44 W. in which Judge Rodney Burress ruled that the current lienholders, Ben G. Hammond and Tana D. Hammons abate any nuisance and maintain it in compliance with all federal, state and city statutes and ordinances. Mr. Dennison contends that it has been over four years, the property is in worse condition, and he wants to know when someone is going to raze it.

Motion to return from Executive Session to regular meeting made by Larry Hatfield, seconded by Lisa Carter at 7:25PM. Ayes carried. 6-0. Mayor stated there was no action taken.
