OTHER SPEAKERS

Perry Cooke – White Flag Shelter (at Mercy Hill Church) – discussed the program which becomes available on any evening when the overnight forecast wind chill is predicted to be below 35 degrees at any point. So far already they have served twenty-five in the last few days. The program serves as a low-barrier shelter, meaning there are no requirements such as identification or other specifics. Soup and sandwich are provided as well as cookies and coffee and a warm place to sleep. The primary need is volunteers who could offer time, especially from 7:30 PM to 9AM.

They are partnering with other homeless assistance organizations, such as Room in the Inn or Bullitt County Housing First, so if they have someone who needs food, clothing, or shoes, it can be provided through those organizations.

Also last year 500 children were deemed needy within the school system.


