Mayor Hockenbury asked for a motion to approve the 9/2/2021 special meeting minutes. Motion made by Lisa Carter. 2nd by Stacey Cline. Motion carried 6-0.

NEW BUSINESS

City Attorney Tammy Baker read the Drug Free Workplace Statement. This is to comply with the CDBG-CV grant. Kenny Newton made motion to adopt. Deb Huffman 2nd. Motion carried 6-0.

City Attorney Tammy Baker read Fair Housing Resolution 2021-10 also in order to comply with the CDBG-CV grant. Deb Huffman made motion to approve. Stacey Cline 2nd. Motion carried 6-0.

City Attorney Tammy Baker read Resolution 2021-11 A Resolution relinquishing ownership and maintenance of Alpha Way (CS-1260) to the State Highway System and accepting ownership and maintenance of Loves Road (KY-6304) and Ohm Drive (KY 3538 Segment) from the State Highway System. Kenny Newton made motion to approve. Stacey Cline 2nd. Motion carried 6-0.

City Attorney Tammy Baker had first reading of Ordinance 021-032 annexing a 69.20-acre tract, by consent, being Myers Lands and lying on the north and south sides of KY 245 and contiguous to the existing boundary of the City of Shepherdsville.

City Attorney Tammy Baker had first reading of Ordinance 021-032 pursuant to KRS 81A.412, annexing into the City of Shepherdsville, Bullitt County, Kentucky 69.20-acre tract, by consent, being Myers Lands and lying on the north and south sides of KY 245 and contiguous to the existing boundary of the City of Shepherdsville. Property held by record by Garland Myers, Bruce Myers, Cheryl Myers, Wanda Whitworth, Barbara Myers, Sharpie Myers, and the Commonwealth of Kentucky by consent of all property owners of record of the properties.

In the recently passed Sunday liquor sales Ordinance we've discovered that we need to amend for the package versus just adding a license to an Ordinance. City Attorney Tammy Baker had first reading of Ordinance 021-033 an Ordinance amending Ordinance 014-151 and 021-029 and repealing Ordinance 009-778 and establishing times that distilled spirits, wine, and malt beverages may be sold within the municipal boundaries of the City of Shepherdsville.

City Attorney Tammy Baker had second reading by Summary of Ordinance 021-030 amending Ordinance 019-283 and 019-296 and adopting a Personnel and Pay Rate Classification Plan for City Employees and Nonelected City Officers. EXECUTIVE SESSION


Kenny Newton made motion to adjourn to Executive Session. Stacey Cline 2nd. Motion carried 6-0.


Kenny Newton made motion to return to Regular Session. Stacey Cline 2nd. Motion carried 6-0.
