Mayor Hockenbury asked for a motion to approve the 9/13/2021 regular meeting minutes. Motion made by Deb Huffman. 2nd by Stacey Cline. Motion carried 5-0-1 absent (BE).

NEW BUSINESS

City Attorney Tammy Baker read Resolution 2021-12 relating to the City of Shepherdsville adopting the KCDBG Procurement Code in relation to spending of funds received pursuant to CDBG Project 20C-114. Lisa Carter made motion to approve. Deb Huffman 2nd. Motion carried 5-0-1 absent.

OLD BUSINESS

City Attorney Tammy Baker had second reading of Ordinance 021-032 annexing a 69.20-acre tract, by consent, being Myers Lands and lying on the north and south sides of KY 245 and contiguous to the existing boundary of the City of Shepherdsville. Kenny Newton made motion to approve. Stacey Cline 2nd. Motion carried 5-0-1 absent.

City Attorney Tammy Baker had second reading of Ordinance 021-033 an Ordinance amending Ordinance 014-151 and 021-029 and repealing Ordinance 009-778 and establishing times that distilled spirits, wine, and malt beverages may be sold within the municipal boundaries of the City of Shepherdsville. Lisa Carter made motion to approve. Stacey Cline 2nd. Motion carried 4 in favor-1 against-1 absent.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

City Engineer Arthur Jones reported on several current projects the Sewer Department is working on: Blue Lick School Pump Station Rehabilitation—bypass pumping to be in place this week; Arrowhead Pump Station Access Drive—construction schedule has been provided; Jack and Bore Gravity Sewer Under Hwy 61; Bernheim Sewer Interceptor Construction—Boring head stuck, new permit was necessary and MAC Construction will be digging up the boring head and establishing a new bore pit; Polymer Feed Pump failure and replacement underway; Sewer relocation plans for Hwy 480 have been submitted; Sewer line construction is underway along Hwy 61 near 245—County's Force main from Landfill will have option to drop into gravity. He asked the Council to take action to order new Camera Truck through HGAC contract pricing of \$208,750. Kenny Newton made motion to accept price and order new Camera Truck. Deb Huffman 2nd. Motion carries 5-0-1 absent.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Mike Hibbard stated he had gotten General Fund details from Tonya now he is waiting on details on Sewer. He also asked about a piece of playground equipment.


Stacey Cline stated she got a call about a wreck on Cedar Grove Road before 480c. Evidently the car went through two or three ditches in the area and tore yards up really bad. Who do they call or what do they do to get their yards fixed? They're elderly and they can't fix their yard because they can't get out and mow their own grass. It's at 398 Cedar Grove Road and the house before it. I do have one other question; when we talked about certification pay for the Sewer Department, is that retro to July 1? There was something that wasn't retroactive. At the last meeting it was the \$2.00 raise for the Class. I'm just trying to figure out which one -- the raise or the certification was just on three, but it went back to the 1st. That's what I thought too; we did go back to July 1. And just the guys that had the license, Just on three. We may have to talk about taking action if that's what you all want to correct. But they were using those guys licenses before that. That's why I thought we did discuss that throughout the budget meetings with the Sewer Department as well.

Deb Huffman inquired if we had heard back from CSX on railroad repairs.

Kenny Newton inquired about the Sewer pay study.
