Philip Logsdon, Auditor with Heartland CPAs presented the Fiscal Year Ended 2020 to the Council. He encouraged the Council to call him with any questions.

City Attorney Tammy Baker had first reading, by Summary of Ordinance 021-034 adopting the revised City of Shepherdsville Employee Handbook.

City Attorney Tammy Baker: Mayor I have looked over the proposed text amendment from the city of Mount Washington my understanding is the way this was generated was the city of Mount Washington made this proposal and send it to the Planning Commission what happens at that point is the Planning Commission and sends it out to all of the cities to see if they want to adopt it. I don't know if anyone has had a chance to look through it it's very detailed. It's very in depth and a lot of it gets into design standards for R-3 zoning it's mostly about apartment buildings and patio homes. Very detailed design standards down to masonry, the way garbage cans are going to look things of that nature. It's up to this Council whether you want to adopt it for the City of Shepherdsville. You can take no action on it and then it's nothing in the City of Shepherdsville. Council Comment: I think we need to wait and research, and we need to get a copy of what we already have on the books and compare. Then we'll make better decisions on what these will do for us or not do for us. Mike Hibbard made motion to table both of these until the next meeting. Bonnie Enlow 2nd. Motion carried 5-0-1 absent.

SIGN IN SPEAKERS

My name is Duane Price, I work for the Sewer Department. Everyone calls me Rocky. I've come to ask questions about the Amendment that was passed for the pay. We're still behind on that. We haven't gotten what we were supposed to get. I'm trying to figure out where we're at and what's going on with that. Stacey Cline: When you say you haven't got what you're supposed to get, did you get something, but you don't think it's right? Rocky Price: I've got the Ordinance right here. It has in here the individuals who are employees that have a Class 3 Collections or Treatment License shall receive \$2 an hour in addition to the base pay and separate from any other raises. If you'll look at the breakdown for the lines, one of them was

fixed. One was not it still shows \$0.50 cents for Collections; I believe the other one shows the \$2.50. It's on the page before that. So that gave \$2.00 for a Class 3 Collections or Class 3 Treatment on top of whatever else you were already getting. Neither did Jeremy Keith. Council member comment: Did you get paid back to July 1st? Duane Price: That would be my next statement that I have is that there is no backpay. There was supposed to be back pay. And I think we had talked about this at the last meeting. And I think the Ordinance that was passed, correct me if I'm wrong. Tonya, you think the Ordinance was passed that did not make it retroactive. So that's going to take an Amendment. Stacey Cline made motion to amend. Bonnie Enlow 2nd. Rocky Price: Personally, I need to specify what we're talking about here to amend \$2.00 to our raise. In the Class 3 Collections and Class 3 Treatment on top of the \$0.50 cents that we get paid for each needs to be an additional \$2.00 above what they're already getting to July 1, 2021. Stacey Cline: Correct, yes. Rocky Price: City Attorney Tammy Baker: Then to discuss briefly, because the way I take this is you're directing me to make that Amendment to the Ordinance because we'll have to Amend the Ordinance so that the next meeting it needs to be clarified, it's \$2.50 for Class 3, plus \$2.00 plus \$1.00. Yes, on Treatment, and \$2.50 plus \$3.00 on Collections. Gayla Bright: They need to come see me because I don't have updated certifications. And the certification pay is contingent upon the valid certification. Rocky Price: I do have one more question. Where do we stand on the assessment for the guys that haven't gotten anything yet? Tonya Taylor: I have received the assessment. I'm going through it right now. I will be meeting with Tom and Arthur or Scott to discuss it in more detail. Then we will do a presentation to the employees and the mayor. Stacey Cline made motion to amend \$2.00 certification raises on the Class 3 licenses retroactive to July 1 2021. Bonnie Enlow 2nd. Motion carried 5-0-1 absent.

Ms. Willie Hines, 205 Webbwood Court. I live in the County; right next to me is a new subdivision going in that belongs to the City. Tonight, I heard some very disturbing news and I wanted to find out about it. They said that the land was going to be divided up into four tracts. And those tracts were going to be auctioned off at the end of this month. I don't understand. I thought it was supposed to be a subdivision. He presented you a plan on how they were going to lay it out. Can they just do that? Why didn't the City know anything about this? Council Comment: Here's the thing, just to clarify, when the Council voted to annex the property and grant the re-zoning; anything beyond that, as far as what's going to happen with the property as long as it's in line with their zoning classification, they don't need permission from the City to do that. They can come here and say, we're going to do X, Y, Z. We can't hold them to that they don't have to. I don't know that we've heard that. But they can say we're going to build a subdivision but if plans change as long as they're acting within their zoning classification, that can do it. Ms. Willie: But when they auction that don't they have to stick to the rules? Council comment: Yes. The zoning classification will be on regardless of who owns that property or what happens. They are bound by the zoning regulations. If they decided to sell it and want to change the zoning, they'll have to come back before the City. It has to stay the way that we approved it.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

City Engineer Arthur Jones reported on several current projects the Sewer Department is working on.

Fire Chief Layne Troutman reported that this year's Trunk or Treat will be at Paroquet Springs from 5:00-8:00 on October 31st.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Bonnie Enlow stated she would like to set a day for the Policy Committee to meet and start discussing the Job Classification Ordinance. After some discussion it was decided to hold the meeting on Tuesday, October 19th at 6:00 p.m.

Stacey Cline stated she would like to thank Officer Proffitt for taking care of an issue that she brought up.




